4. Project Details

i) What will be done?

Parents will learn strategies and receive information and tools to help them actively support the math curriculum and their teens as they practice numeracy skills and learn about the grade 9 curriculum. Parents will understand how numerical literacy and vocabulary concepts can be introduced to young people using plain-language and clear examples and will learn to identify opportunities where they can support numeracy and literacy at home.

ii) Why do you want to organize this project?

Math achievement continues to be an area of focus at our school, as identified through our EQAO scores as well as through parent expressed interest.. We believe this workshop will help engage both students and parents, and that it will equip the parents to support their children's math learning.

iii) How does this enhance parent engagement in support of improved student achievement, human rights and equity, and well-being?

We will invite four of our Board's Math numeracy consultants as well as Math teachers and teachers from other disciplines at the school to support and share fun activities and ways in which families can support their child in learning numeracy at home.
